

The Catholic Relief Services' Rice Bowls

Catholics from 14,000 communities across the US use nearly 3 million rice bowls, which are turned in at the end of Lent. Seventy-five percent goes to support Catholic Relief Services' humanitarian and development programs outside the US, while 25% remains in Arkansas. In the Diocese of Little Rock, \$26,924.08 was collected in 2021. 25% of the money, or \$6,731.02 remained in Arkansas to assist low-income families assisted by Catholic Charities of Arkansas. Holy Thursday Collection

God is answering our prayers for an increase in vocations to the diocesan priesthood. There are currently 21 seminarians. Five priests were ordained in 2021 and two priestly ordinations are anticipated this year.

Msgr. James E. O'Connell started an endowment fund for our diocese seminarians over 50 years ago. This fund has been invested over the years and has helped cover the cost of educating our seminarians. Today the cost of educating one seminarian is \$36,000 per year, which includes tuition, room and board, health insurance and other needs. With 21 seminarians, the fund can no longer cover the cost of educating all of them. **We need your help!**

The diocese invites you to consider partnering with them in preparing these young men for the priesthood. Your contributions will be used to pay the cost of educating our seminarians this year. Please make your check payable to your parish or the Diocese of Little Rock.


Holy Land Collection

EVERYTHING IS CHANGED

Easter changes everything. Having been raised from the dead, Jesus shatters the frightful images that haunt humanity. Betrayal, torture, crucifixion, death, burial—these terrors pale in the brilliant glory of Jesus resurrected. Today's psalm guides our response to God's power: "it is wonderful in our eyes." Today is indeed a day for wonder, for gasping in astonishment at Jesus' resurrection. For all of human history, death had been final. In the Acts of the Apostles, though, Peter testifies that Jesus, who was publicly executed, was raised to life by God. John's Gospel admits that the disciples "did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead." Even Jesus' closest friends were not expecting this innovation: life after death. In response to the Easter miracle, Paul tells us to become "a fresh batch of dough." Everything, even our very selves, must become new. Easter changes everything.
