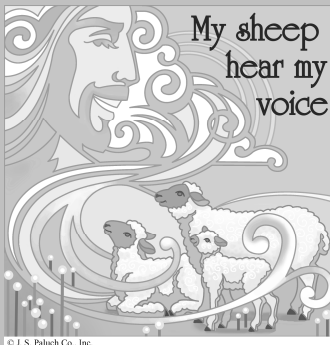

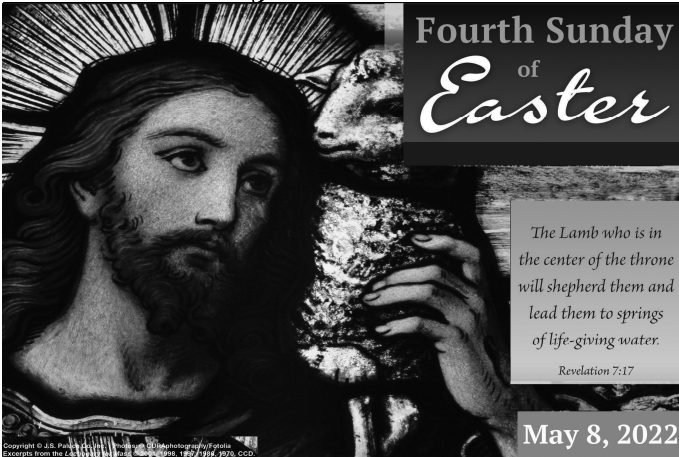

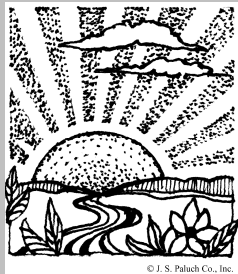
### Knights of Columbus to Sponsor Parish Outing to NWA Naturals Baseball Game!!
